## **Call for Applications:**

## Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Teaching Assistantships

The Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program at UNM invites applications for graduate teaching assistantships, with appointments beginning in Fall 2022 and continuing through Spring 2023. WGSS assistantships are open to graduate students in any discipline at the University of New Mexico. Graduate students with research interests in feminist, gender, and sexuality studies are strongly encouraged to apply.

WGSS teaching assistants carry a .25 appointment, which includes a stipend, a tuition waiver of up to 6 credits during the semester of appointment, and the standard health insurance premium coverage provided by UNM for graduate assistants. WGSS teaching assistants are responsible for teaching one course each semester, typically a section of GNDR 2110. If you are a PhD candidate (ABD or beyond) and you are interested in potentially teaching a WGSS topics course as well, please see the application directions below. These topics courses should be on topics that are both relevant to the WGSS undergraduate curriculum and have not been covered by our regular course of study recently. (Please consult with the director if you are unsure about this or wish to discuss your proposed topic.)

Please note: in Fall 2022, the WGSS program will be debuting an Online Max section of GNDR 2110. If you accept this position, you may be asked to work as a teaching assistant for this online course.

To qualify as a WGSS TA, candidates must be students of good standing enrolled in a graduate degree program at UNM and have a demonstrable scholarly interest in feminist, gender, and/or sexuality studies. We will prioritize applicants in the following fashion:

- Those who have enrolled in the WGSS Transcripted Graduate Certificate program, or who have a demonstrable intention of enrolling in the certificate program at the time of appointment.
- Completion of WMST 510 and/or WMST 512 (or equivalent) with a minimum GPA of 3.5.
- Those who have not previously received assistantship funding from WGSS. Appointments typically will be capped at two years.
- Those who have enrolled in or will enroll in the Graduate Teaching Academy offered by the Center for Teaching Excellence (http://grad.unm.edu/resources/gta.html).

To apply, please provide the following documents:

- 1. A two page cover letter addressing your scholarly and pedagogical interests in feminist, gender, and/or sexuality studies. This letter should also 1) discuss your teaching philosophy, including any experience and/or interest in teaching online; 2) detail any previous experience working with students in or outside of a classroom setting; and 3) indicate how teaching features in your future professional goals.
- 2. A CV
- 3. Proof of enrollment in a graduate program at UNM (this could include a copy of your acceptance letter or unofficial graduate transcripts).
- 4. A list of any relevant graduate coursework in WGSS (broadly construed, including feminist, gender, and sexuality studies). This includes both coursework taken with our program, other courses taken at UNM, and courses taken elsewhere.
- 5. Two letters of recommendation printed on official letterhead. Both letters should be written by professors who can speak to your academic strengths and your teaching potential. Ideally these letters will address your academic background in feminist, gender, and/or sexuality studies. These letters should be submitted to the director under separate cover (a pdf copy via email is preferred).
- 6. An original draft syllabus for a section of an introductory WGSS course (such as GNDR 2110); alternately, you may submit a 1-2 page discursive description of how you would approach teaching a section of such a class.
- 7. For PhD candidates who are ABD: optionally, you may submit a one page proposal for an undergraduate course you would like to teach for WGSS. This course should represent the WGSS program's interdisciplinarity as well as intersectional and inclusive pedagogies.
